- What extracurricular opportunities (sports, competitions) are available for students?
- How do students get to school?
- Does the school have a program for gifted students?
- How does this school support students who have academic, social or emotional difficulties?
- What strategies are used to teach students who are not fluent in Urdu?
- What are some of the biggest challenges this school faces?
- How does this school keep parents informed of school information and activities?
- How much outdoor time do kids get each day?
- Where do students go after Matric? How many continue their studies?
- Are teachers available to help students make important decisions about classes?
- What is the school drop-out rate?

Monitoring and evaluation provides a consolidated source of information of project progress that contributes to transparency, accountability, retention and finally to the development of an institution. It also helps in the evidence-based policy making and ensures that desired outcomes are achieved.

After 1 O'clock they completed their class rooms visit and they took Photographs met a parent said bye.

Final examination 2019:

Annual, exam is a test given to students at the end of a course of study or training. Although the term can be used in the context of physical training, it most often occurs in the academic world.

Making significant changes to the academic year schedule, the Sindh government has announced that from this year the annual summer vacations would begin from May 1st and end on June 30th, while the academic year would start on July 1st.

According to a statement issued by the Sindh Information Department, it was decided that annual examinations in schools will be held between March 20 and April 30, which would be followed immediately by two months of summer vacations. Schools will begin the new academic year from July 1.

Moreover, it was decided that all the national days including Kashmir Day, Pakistan Day, Independence Day, Shah Abdul Latif Bhittai Day, Eid Miladun Nabi and Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah's death anniversary will be celebrated with great enthusiasm at schools and colleges to ensure that students learn about the importance of these national days.

As per direction of the Higher UPs, the academic session is starting from 1st July instead of 1st April, therefore the annual Examination of class Nursery to class 8 will be held in the month of March & April 2019. Principal asked to teaching staff to ensure that they follow the instruction regarding the conduct of annual Examination 2019.

1. Written/ printed date sheet must be communicated and circulated among the students before the conduct of annual Examination 2019.
2. Exam time for all subjects and classes shall be 8:00 A.M to 11.30 AM.
3. Ensure the paper marking on daily basis and maintain the result.

4. Results of Annual Examination 2019 will be declared on 30th April.
5. PTM (Parent Teacher Meeting) must be ensuring at the time of Result Announcement Day.
6. Ceremony of Result Announcement must be held in school.
7. Position Holders must be encouraged by giving them Awards.
8. Presence of all Staff in school is compulsory during and after the conduct of Examination.
9. All staff will remain in school during hours and closing hours for marking of papers and compilation of result.
